POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME (PCOS)



What is PCOS?

An **endocrine** (hormonal imbalance) disorder, causing **fluid-filled sacs** to develop in the ovaries.

Affects 1 in 10 women in Singapore!

PCOS patients are at an increased risk for infertility, Diabetes Mellitus,
High blood pressure, high cholesterol, sleep apnea, depression, and even endometrial cancer



Insulin resistance in the body

High amounts of insulin causes excessive testosterone to be produced by the ovaries, disturbing normal ovulation.

WHAT CAUSES PCOS?



Hormonal changes (such as luteinising hormone, testosterone, or prolactin)



Genetics Women with PCOS are 50% more likely to have an immediate female relative with PCOS



Irregular periods (but heavy flow)

Symptoms

Oily skin, acne

Excessive hair growth on face, chest, back

Weight gain

Difficulty getting pregnant

Irregular periods (irregular ovlution)

Diagnosis: 2 out of 3



Excessive testosterone (via blood test or symptoms)

Ovaries are enlarged, with multiple fluid-filled sacs seen (scans)



Awareness, lifestyle:

Lose weight, diet control, exercise

EVEN 5-10% WEIGHT
LOSS IS GREAT IN
DECREASING LONGTERM HEALTH RISKS!

Supportive treatment

- Contraceptive pills for more regular periods
- Hair removal
- Medicine for infertility (eg Clomifene)

Surgery

Monitoring and **management** of long term health conditions
